

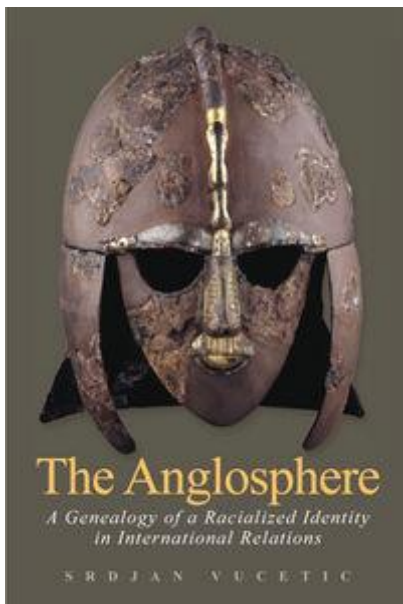

The Anglosphere: A Region Hidden in Plain Sight

Most definitions of regions underscore physical or geographic proximity. As we discussed in Session I, the importance of this element has diminished thanks to a series of revolutions in transportation and communication technologies over the past two hundred or so years. Today's session will focus on the "Anglosphere" – an ocean-spanning grouping of states that, Prof. Vucetic will argue, can be distinguished from a broader global society of which it is part. What is gained and what is lost by qualifying an entity like the Anglosphere as a region? In other words, does "conceptual stretching" help us understand aspects of international life that are missing from the standard literature on the world of regions?
