#### Lesson topic

This course is the general introduction to international commercial arbitration in the context of a typical international business dispute to facilitate the understanding of the students. In addition to books and academic papers, various materials such as video clips and documents used in a real arbitration case are used.

#### Lesson target

By the end of the course students should:

- i. understand the legal nature of international commercial arbitration and how it works in the real world.
- ii. have a general understanding of the stages of arbitration procedure and the roles played by counsels, arbitrators and arbitral institution.
- iii. understand the most important legal issues in international commercial arbitration
- iv. understand the position of international commercial arbitration among the other dispute resolution mechanisms for international business disputes
- v. understand the legal framework surrounding international commercial arbitration and the changes

#### Syllabus and plan

1. Introduction to ICA
2. Starting arbitration (videoclip Part 1)
3. Discussion session
4. Challenge to arbitrator and Hearing on jurisdiction (videoclip Part 2&3)
5. Discussion session
6. Hearing on merits (videoclips Part 4)
7. Discussion session

Students are requested to watch the video clips and read the references beforehand and to send point out one or two issues which are difficult to understand by email to the lecturers at latest three days before the classwork.

#### Evaluation method

Students will be assessed as follows:

50% performance in class

50% written report

A written report of 1,500-2,000 words will be required at the end of the course. There will be some flexibility on the choice of topic.

#### Evaluation baseline

Assessment will be made according to the attainment of the Course objective indicated above.
