Lesson topic

International Investment Law and Investment Arbitration have become a new academic focus for international law scholars, a booming business field for law professionals including attorneys and in-house legal officers, an important investment decision-making consideration for transnational companies, and a serious policy issue for governments. Therefore, International Investment Law and investment arbitration are of increasing importance for law school students who have a plan to be involved in transnational business.

Lesson target

The course is aimed to introduce to students the main regimes and mechanisms of International Investment Law and their operation in practice.
By the end of this course, it is expected that participants will have a better view on International Investment Law and on Investment Arbitration, with a better understanding of the current issues at stake in this field of International Law.

Syllabus and plan

Twelve topics (in Fifteen lectures) covering the evolution of international investment law (including criticisms on and reform of international investment law); legal framework regulating foreign investment (e.g. bilateral investment treaties, investment chapters in free trade agreements, multilateral investment treaties); scope of application of investment treaties; substantive rules applicable to foreign investments (fair and equitable treatment, full protection and security, direct and indirect expropriation); investor-state investment arbitration mechanism; etc.

There will be a total of fifteen lectures covering various topics (see p. 3 and 4).

NB: the topics and schedule may be adjusted depending on our progress over the days.

Evaluation method

The evaluation will be based on the work to be done on the Case study, 50% on the written submissions and 50% on the short oral pleadings. Participation to the other parts of the course will also be taken into account.

Evaluation baseline

Grades will be determined in accordance with the degrees of achievement of the objectives, i.e., understanding of the question raised, clarity of the reasoning, relevance of the arguments used.
