Lesson topic

The course consists of two separate parts taught by Prof. Yun Zhao of the University of Hong Kong and Mr. Jeff Leong, Senior Partner of Jeff Leong, Poon & Wong (JLPW) in Malaysia.

[Part 1: Prof. Yun Zhao]

The legal systems of Mainland China and Hong Kong are explained by a professor of law from the University of Hong Kong. The dispute resolution system including both litigation and other ADR systems, which are especially important for China-related international business is discussed with the up-to-date information.

[Part 2: Mr. Jeff Leong]

In part 2, Mr. Jeff Leong, Senior Partner of Jeff Leong, Poon & Wong (JLPW) of Malaysia, will explore an overview of the common law legal systems of Malaysia and Singapore, the two dynamic member countries of the Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN) and how law interacts with foreign direct investments and cross business transactions in the fast-growing ASEAN region.

Lesson target

[Part 1: Prof Yun Zhao]

The participants will get a sound and basic understanding of legal systems and dispute resolution mechanisms concerning international business in East Asia, which is especially important for working as in-house counsels of Japan-based MNEs as well as business law practitioners in Japan in their future.

[Part 2: Mr. Jeff Leong]

The participants will get an overview of Malaysia and Singapore legal systems, and the basic skills required in international and cross border transactions and investments in support of Japanese and other foreign investors doing business in the ASEAN region. This course is useful for Japanese lawyers and in-house counsels handling cross border investments and M&As for Japanese companies.
